- The Fire Ant Eradication Program ignored the impact on ground-nesting native bees, like the Blue-Banded Bee, and the insecticide used harms native bees and ants.
- Aerial treatments have been applied to residential rooftops, contaminating drinking water tanks, dams, and waterways.
- Residents, pets, horses and wildlife have been seriously harmed & killed
- Aerial and ground baiting conducted on the same day or just before rain, rendering the treatment ineffective.
- Workers enter private properties without police checks
- Lack of Environmental Oversight: The program has failed to conduct an Environmental Impact Study or Risk Assessment

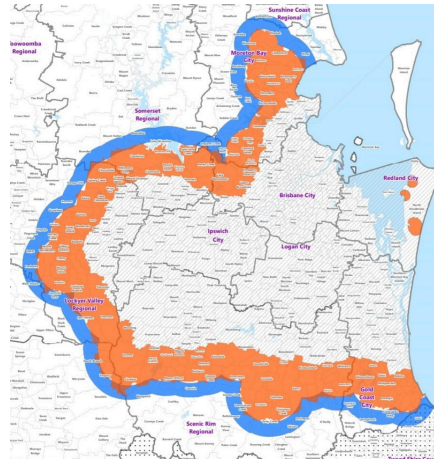
Our Community Objectives

1. Immediate halt to the National Fire Ant Eradication Program
2. Focus on controlling fire ant populations in high-infested areas, minimising harm to non-target species and the environment
3. Responsible Poison Use: Only use poisons in areas with known fire ant nests, reducing unnecessary chemical application and protecting biodiversity
4. Biosecurity concerning Privacy Act: Prevent unlawful entry into private land
5. Prevent Fire Ant Spread: Prohibit transport of fire ants through mulch, soil, equipment, and products
6. Empower Landowners to self treat private land with environmentally safe methods

What You Can Do To Help

4. Put up signs to protect your home
5. Inform & support your community

Reasonable Excuse

To be exempt from the program, all you have to do is provide a 'Reasonable Excuse' such as:

1. No Fire Ants exist on my property.
2. This property has Indigenous Blue-Banded Bees, and these insecticides are harmful to them.
3. ABC and Channel 9 reports show that these poisons have injured or killed dogs, bees, birds, cows and horses.
4. I haven't received any Environmental Impact Study or Risk Assessment on the effects of these insecticides on my property.
5. Distribution of poison over my property doesn't align with the management practices of my operations.
